

**NOTICE UNDER SECTION 131(3) OF THE BIOSECURITY ACT 1993 OF
MOVEMENT CONTROLS ON KIWIFRUIT BUDWOOD USED FOR GRAFTING ON
ORCHARDS (EXCLUDING BUDWOOD USED FOR PLANT PROPAGATION OR
GRAFTING BY NURSERIES)**

1. Pursuant to section 131(3) of the Biosecurity Act 1993, I hereby give notice that the following controls apply to all kiwifruit (*Actinidia* spp.) budwood used for grafting on orchards (excluding budwood used for plant propagation or grafting by nurseries which is covered by *Notice under section 131(3) of the biosecurity act 1993 of movement controls on kiwifruit rootstock, plants and any part of a kiwifruit plant used in plant propagation*) moved into, out of, within or between areas declared as controlled areas for the purpose of managing the spread of *Pseudomonas syringae* pv. *actinidiae* under the National Psa-V Pest Management Plan.
2. These controls apply to all areas declared as controlled areas in the **Notice of Declaration of Controlled Areas Under Section 131(2) of the Biosecurity Act 1993, in Respect of the Pest, *Pseudomonas syringae* pv. *actinidiae*.**
3. Movement controls apply to kiwifruit budwood as follows:
 - a) The following movements of kiwifruit budwood are allowed, subject to meeting the conditions set out under clause (4):
 - i. All movements within an Exclusion Region;
 - ii. All movements from an Exclusion Region to a Containment Region or to a Recovery Region;
 - iii. Movements from Psa-V “not detected” orchards in a Containment Region to other orchards within the same Containment Region (Note: an exception to this is where an additional ‘controlled area’ or ‘restricted place’ is established under the Biosecurity Act 1993, by KVH or an authorised person, within part of the Containment Region to aggressively contain infection on Psa-V “positive” orchards and surrounding properties. Where this is the case, any additional movement controls will apply over and above the controls in this notice);
 - iv. Movements from Psa-V “not detected” orchards in a Containment Region to a Recovery Region; and
 - v. Movements from Psa-V “not detected” orchards in a Recovery Region to other sites or orchards within the same Recovery Region.
 - b) The following movements of kiwifruit budwood are prohibited:
 - i. All movements from a Recovery Region to a Containment Region or to an Exclusion Region; and
 - ii. All movements from a Containment Region to an Exclusion Region.
 - c) All other movements of kiwifruit budwood that are not covered under sub-clause 3 a) or b) above are restricted and may only be carried out with a permission issued by KVH, including:
 - i. All movements from a Psa-V “positive” orchards;
 - ii. All movements between Recovery Regions;
 - iii. All movements between Containment Regions;
 - iv. All movements between Exclusion Regions;
 - v. All movements from outside of Exclusion Regions, Containment Regions or Recovery Regions, into an Exclusion Region or a Containment Region.

4. The following conditions apply to movements of kiwifruit budwood:
- a) All suppliers of budwood must adhere to the 'KVH Protocol: Budwood', available on the KVH website (<http://www.kvh.org.nz/indgrafters>).
 - b) The following suppliers of kiwifruit budwood must be registered with KVH:
 - i. Any entity or person supplying budwood from a Containment Region or an Exclusion Region; and
 - ii. Any entity or person supplying kiwifruit budwood from a Recovery Region, either to:
 - more than 5 KPINs;
 - or for grafting an orchard, or orchards, of total area greater than 50 hectares.
 - c) All suppliers of kiwifruit budwood defined in sub-clause 4 b) must have, and implement, a 'KVH Psa-V Risk Management Plan: Budwood' that meets the 'KVH Psa-V Risk Management Plan Requirements: Budwood', including the following requirements:
 - i. All budwood awaiting distribution must be securely stored and managed to prevent contamination or dispersal of plant material;
 - ii. Covered transport must be used and all vehicles used for transport must be clean and free of plant material and soil before leaving the orchard;
 - iii. To ensure traceability, all suppliers of budwood must ensure all budwood is (or bags of budwood are) clearly labelled, and maintain records of where the budwood was collected, including the orchard and location within that orchard, and its distribution destination; and
 - iv. The records referred to in iii. above must be maintained for at least five years, and must be made available to KVH within 7 days of request by KVH.
5. Any kiwifruit budwood moved in contravention of this notice may be seized by an inspector or authorised person and destroyed, treated or otherwise dealt with.
6. Failure to comply with the requirements of this notice may result in a prosecution under the Biosecurity Act 1993. If convicted an individual could be liable to a term of imprisonment not exceeding 3 months, or a fine not exceeding \$50,000 or both. A corporation convicted of an offence under this notice is liable to a fine not exceeding \$100,000.
